
Today is the 4th of July. Happy Independence Day! As you may know, our town was named after one of the Lord's greatest evangelists of all time--George Whitefield. Originally, Whitefield was settled in 1770 as Balltown.

Even though George Whitefield was never in Maine, the town of Balltown, a predominantly Irish Catholic community were saved by his ministry to the point that they even changed the town's name.

The 4th of July parade is a big deal in our little town and everyone shows up by the hundreds. (Well over a thousand this year--an oldtimer told us "it grows every year!) We are always looking for ways to share Jesus Christ. This morning during my Quiet Time, God gave me a wonderful idea—to take an active part in next year's parade.

God blessed our country with two great revivals. The first Great Awakening occurred with Whitefield in 1740. It bore such lasting results, causing our founding Fathers to establish a Christian Nation, "One Nation under God!" George Washington said, "It is impossible to govern the world without <u>God</u> and the <u>Bible</u>!" In his farewell address, Washington also said, "Of all dispensations and habits which lead to political prosperity; religion and morality are indispensable reports. In vain would a man claim the tribute of patriotism who should labor to subvert these great pillars".

Wow! Our Founding Father basically said you can't be a patriot without being a Christian. If you think this is too strong a statement, then listen to what Patrick Henry wrote--"It cannot be emphasized to strongly or too often that this great nation was founded, not on religions but by Christians; not on religions but on the gospel of Jesus Christ!"
